

DO YOUR PART TO STOP THE SEWAGE!

Congress is now considering appropriating \$310 million more of the \$900 million needed to fix the broken wastewater treatment plant on the US side of the border. The funding must be approved by the House Appropriations Committee before it can be considered by the full House of Representatives.
