Whitney Antrim and Alexia Palacios-Peters from our CUSD: Whitney is finishing her term, encouraged us to consider running for School Board and/or City Council and to contact her for advice and encouragement. This coming Tuesday, 5pm (also live streamed) is a special CUSD Board meeting with all subgroups (such as COSA, Safe Harbor, etc), to see if we need a more comprehensive policy or if we're in a good place. She reminded us to celebrate that "School Board meetings are boring again!" meaning they are back to doing the business of education.

A review of significant achievements included the "Stop the Sewage" campaign, and a surge in membership.
