By the age of 12, Malala was writing a blog about her life under the Taliban using a pseudonym. Because of her activism she was shot in the head by a terrorist as she left school. Her attack sparked international outrage and support. For subsequent extensive and extraordinary work, she became the youngest-ever Nobel Laureate at age 17 for the Nobel Peace Prize. Since then, she completed her college education in England and continues her activism for girls' and women's rights in areas of oppression through the Malala Fund. Malala is a model for the spirit of democratic values and ideals. It is because of her diligence in leadership and activism for those living in oppression that this scholarship is dedicated.

Please note: All essay content must be original. The use of Al or other sources of information on the Essays must be cited for the application to be considered. If a committee member discovers content from another source without being cited, the application will be disregarded.

APPLICATION:

1. **Personal Statement** that does not exceed 500 words and includes 1) Your educational objective(s) and/or career plans; 2) Your need for scholarship/financial assistance; 3) Campus, family, and community activities/commitments; 4) Any additional information that you would like the committee to know about you.

Personal Statement will be evaluated on 1) campus/community engagement, 2) academic achievement and challenges encountered in pursuing your academic goals, 3) financial need, and 4) grammar and composition.

- 2. **Prompts:** Answer these prompts in 300 words or less for each one.
 - **a.** How are you currently involved in the political process, for example from small/local to larger/national levels, etc.?
 - **b.** What does it mean to you to be a Democrat and how do you live those values?
 - **c.** Discuss two political issues that are important to you, including how you think the Democratic Party should act and advocate on the issues.

Prompts will be evaluated on 1) level of involvement in our political process in the past and now, 2) demonstrated understanding of our democracy, 3) demonstrated understanding of what membership in the Democratic Party means, 4) clear identification of two issues, why they are important to you, and what you will do and hope the Party will do to make a difference on these issues in the future.
